



Embed SWF in Adobe PDF

This is a demonstration document that shows a SWF file embedded in an Adobe Acrobat PDF.

The first is actually an embedded URL rather than the SWF file. This allows for full virtual tours to be played out within the document. The SWF files are called from a server; this also reduces the file size of the PDF. As the SWF files are called from a server you will get a security warning telling you that the document is trying to connect to the server, tick the *Remember My Action for this site* and then click *Allow*. This will stop further warnings.



A picture of the tour is placed in the document so if viewed in a viewer other than Adobe Acrobat you will see the still pictures instead of the tour. This also helps lining up the Tour when you embed it in the document.

The next example is an Object2VR project, as it is only one file the SWF can be directly embedded in the PDF. This stops the security warnings as there is no need to download any files.



Again an image is used to line up the embedded SWF as well as show an image for non-Acrobat viewers.
